

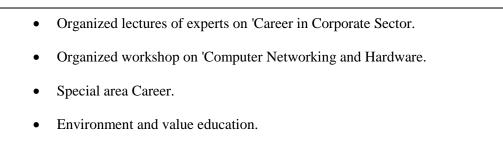

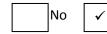

The ratio of women is more than men in this district and there is a less influence of higher education girls.

Hence, it was required for to intervene in this practice so that the practice 'Lek Ladki Abhiyan' be made more useful for girl students. Having this focus in mind the concept of 'Lek Ladki Abhiyan' has been introduced continuously since the academic year 2011-12.

- 3. Objectives of the practice:
 - 1. To motivate the girl students for higher education.
 - 2. To provide financial assistance to needy girl students.
 - 3. To help underprivileged girl students.
 - 4. To bring girl students and their mother together organizing 'May Lekincha Sneh Melava' (Get together of girl students and their mothers).
 - 5. To organize lectures on various topics for women.

4. The practice:

In this innovative practice the following was done:

One of the most important initiatives organized by the college is Lek Ladki Abhiyan'. Collected fund through Bhaubeej Nidhi caters to need of financially distressed girl students. The college organized Women's Gathering, lectures on 'Law for Women', personal hygiene, Hemoglobin Checking camp. Free bus passes given to needy girl students.
